CIBER WINS \$58 MILLION PENNSYLVANIA TURNPIKE COMMISSION PROJECT Helps PTC Build “PRIDE” ERP Project

HARRISBURG, Penn. – May 15, 2006 – CIBER, Inc. (NYSE: CBR) today announced it has been awarded a \$58 million supplement to its contract with the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission (PTC) to integrate and implement mySAP™ Business Suite™, the world's most comprehensive family of adaptive business applications, that will benefit nearly every functional area of the organization. The PTC has been anticipating this project for some time, seeking to transform its information technology (IT) systems into a single, integrated, and state-of-the-art system to increase the organization’s ability to plan, conduct business, and react more efficiently to the needs of its customers.

CIBER made the announcement in concert with the ASUG/Sapphire SAP trade show being held May 15 – May 18 in Orlando, Fla., where CIBER is exhibiting in booth #1758. The PTC has named the project PRIDE—“PTC Readiness for an Integrated Decision-making Enterprise.”

Currently, the PTC has multiple systems which rely on outdated technology and operate as stand-alone systems, separating important pieces of historical and operational data across many platforms, and making trend analysis and decision-making difficult and time-consuming.

PRIDE will benefit all areas of the PTC’s business, including finance, bids, contracts, procurement, asset management, fleet management, fund management, post-sales support, human resources and e-commerce. As a result, “PTC will realize significant benefits, such as streamlined and standardized administrative and financial processes; expanded financial reporting and analysis capabilities; elimination of multiple, disparate information systems; elimination of redundant activities; centralized operational and historical data for trend analysis; and integration of secure internet technology to provide data access to employees, retirees, and fiduciaries” said Ed Burns, President of CIBER’s State and Local Government Practice.

“Project PRIDE is an example of innovative, forward-looking thinking on the part of the PTC and its partners,” said Rand Blazer, president of SAP Public Services, which is responsible for the corporation’s government sector. “It implements a dramatic transformation that will benefit citizens not just today, but ten to 15 years in the future.”

The project is actually the second phase of a two-phase project. During phase one, which concluded in March, CIBER provided leadership for the ERP software selection process, assessed the PTC’s IT systems and business processes, and identified what the PTC must do to revamp its infrastructure. CIBER won the project’s first phase over competition from Accenture, Deloitte, IBM, and Bearing Point because of its partnership approach with the PTC and its objective to minimize project risk.

CIBER Novasoft, the SAP services division of CIBER, is an SAP Alliance Partner and a Preferred Services Partner for Public Services in the U.S. CIBER also has a Strategic Go-To-Market Partnership with SAP in retail, public services (including higher education), and radio frequency identification (RFID). CIBER has assisted many departments of transportation with their IT initiatives, including projects for the Denver Regional Transportation District (RTD) and Wyoming Department of Transportation.

“This project is significant for the PTC, and we are pleased and honored to have been selected to play such a critical role in helping PTC redefine and implement a new business model,” said David E.
